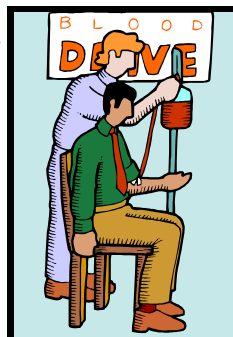

RELAX AND REST EASY

Sometimes I sit at my desk and just wonder about things. Today, I was wondering why our annuity business is doing so well – up about 70% over last year. Not that I am unhappy or troubled by business being good. I am in sales, and when business is good, the sun seems to shine a little brighter, food tastes better, and I find myself singing along with the radio. It's nice. But what I ponder is this: why now and not all the time? What is it about market downturns that cause people to suddenly think that they need a position that includes a stable GUARANTEED product like a K of C retirement annuity? Doesn't the market always turn down sooner or later? So why not establish a GUARANTEED alternative to balance those swings? As I pondered, I enlisted the help of my friend and co-worker Tony Minopoli, who is our senior vice president of investments. Here is the scenario I asked him to help me with. Two 55-year-old men in the United States on January 1, 1999. Both have \$50,000, and are looking for a place to put it for ten years. One decides to invest it in the S and P 500 and leave it there for ten years (ten years!), paying taxes on dividends as they are paid, and spending more than a little time worrying about the effects of inflationary pressure on global currency that could impact the performance of the U.S. markets (I just made that up, but it sounds like something I may have heard once.) The other guy (I'm resisting calling him the "smart guy") puts his \$50,000 in a tax deferred retirement annuity with the Knights of Columbus, with all the guarantees that come with it. He leaves it here for ten years, and spends absolutely no time worrying about it. Never even crosses his mind. He's tap dancing to the mailbox. Ten years later and its December 31, 2008 (notice that to be fair I am using a date before the most recent market madness). Both men are now 65-years-old and starting to consider retirement. They check on the \$50,000. Our S and P fellow, Tony tells me, would have an account value of \$43,494.17, an annual compounded return of -1.38% per year. And he paid taxes along the way on those dividends. Our K of C tax-deferred annuity fellow would find a balance that

has swelled to \$78,152.41, for an annual compounded return of 4.57% -- and the power of deferring taxes has not been factored in. I have nothing against money in the market – some of mine is there. Or it used to be there. But I do wonder why more of our members and their families don't take advantage of our guaranteed retirement annuity product. You get a great return, defer taxes, prepare for retirement and get to sleep at night. Not a bad deal. So, regardless of where you think the market is headed right now, why not prepare yourself for the inevitable downturn, and build yourself something guaranteed. Call your agent. Establishing an annuity is a simple, quick, easy process. Then relax and rest easy. We'll do the rest.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Amber's Bacon Wrapped Chicken Picante

Start with your favorite Amber Ale and drink at least two ales prior to starting.

Ingredients:

Foster Farm Chicken Breast (You make the call on how many)
25 oz can of Embasa Jalapeño's (sliced)
15 oz can of Dole Chunk Pineapple
1 pack Farmer John Bacon (Hickory Smoked)
1 pound bag Kraft Mexican Style Shredded Cheese
1 bottle Kikkoman Teriyaki Glaze
1 bottle Worcestershire Sauce
1 box of toothpicks



The Big Put Together

- 1) Lay down 3 strips of bacon in an x-cross pattern
- 2) Filet chicken breast to make 2 out of 1 (making it easy to roll)
- 3) Lay filet on top of bacon
- 4) Lay down 2 jalapeño slices on top of chicken
- 5) Add cheese on top of jalapeño (be generous)
- 6) Add 2 chunks of pineapple
- 7) Roll chicken like a burrito and jam a toothpick in to hold in place
- 8) Wrap bacon around the chicken burrito to hold in all the ingredients
- 9) Make sure there are NO openings so the cheese does not ooze out
- 10) Slam another toothpick in to keep the bacon in place
- 11) Mix the glaze with the Worcestershire sauce to your liking
- 12) Have another Amber Ale or your beverage of choice
- 13) Baste the wrap with mix then slam in oven @ 350deg for 20min

BBQ Style

Slam on grill grab an icy cold beverage and baste after each turn so it does not stick to grill

Usually take about 15-20 min of grilling

- 14) Baste again let cook for additional 10min (now eat)

Most of the personal listed here have recently been injured in Afghanistan or Iraq and have been returned to the U.S. at Walter Reed Medical Center or another military hospital.

These Young Men and Ladies need our prayers and letters to help them make the recoveries that they need and to let them know that our country has not forgotten them, and we do support them. We need to give them the encouragement that they so desperately need.

If all the brother Knights could just send a simple get well card to them it would mean so much to them.

It is really simple Just address your card to the Name of the person and include his rank and Company. And mail it to:

Lcpl. Dominic 2/8

He was the sole survivor of an IED blast to a vehicle while serving in Afghanistan. He suffered the amputation of one of his legs & the other one is badly broken along with several internal injuries. He was on his second deployment and was married in Feb.2009.

Sgt. Joel

In late May Sgt. Joel was on assignment in Djibouli Africa when he suffered a traumatic brain injury. It was caused by an accident in an ambulance in which he was riding. His injuries have affected his memory, speech and balance.

Sgt. Joshua 2ond Recon

Sgt. Joshua's convoy was hit by an IED in Afghanistan in early July 2009. He suffered the loss of one leg and multiple fractures including his back and arm.

Sgt. Eddie 3/2

Eddie was shot twice in the head in April 2005. One bullet hit his jaw but the other went into his brain. Eddie has been in the fight of his life and is doing better than expected. On 7/9/2009 he was removed from the Marine Corps permanent retirement list and reinstated.

LCpl. Robert E. 2/3

In April 2009 Robert was involved in an accident and sustained numerous injuries including an amputation of one leg. He is looking forward to receiving some mail.

PFC. Joshua M. 2nd LAAD

80 –85 % of Joshua's body was burned in mid May 2009. This young man was happy to know that people care that he recovers.

LCpl. Tim 1/1 Bravo Co.

Tim was wounded in Africa during a live round training exercise at the end of May. He suffered shrapnel wounds to the throat, chest and stomach. He has had surgeries and is waiting for the swelling to go down before more can be done.

SSGT Jeremy 2ond Recon

Jeremy was wounded in April 2009 in Afghanistan by an IED blast to both of his legs. His legs had to be amputated and he sustained fractures to other bones as well.

LCpl Michael

Suffered a gun shot wound that has affected the use of his arms. He would love to get cards.

CPL. John M. 2/7

He was injured in June 2008 in Afghanistan by an IED blast. He sustained damage to his hands and one leg. His recovery has been strenuous on both mind and body. He said he would like to receive cards.

SGT. Gary 2/7

Gary was injured by an IED blast in April 2007. He has been in the hospital since this date. His neck was broken in 9 places and has severe breaks to both of his legs and ankles. Please continue sending cards!

CPL. Jake 2nd CEB

Jake was injured in Afghanistan in April 2009 when he stepped on an IED. Both legs had to be amputated below his knees. He also has shrapnel wounds, one of which needed skin grafts. The same day he was injured his Grandfather passed away.

SGT. Courtney

Courtney was injured in Afghanistan in August 2008. He was a passenger in a humvee that was hit by an IED and lost his left leg below the knee and sustained fractures to his right leg.

LCpl. Peter 2nd IAR

Peter was injured in Iraq when the IAV in which he was riding was in an accident. He is being treated for TBI at a multi trauma facility.

SGT. Justin 2/7

Justin was wounded in Afghanistan and lost both of his legs. He plans to be a drill instructor and continue his career with the Marines.

HM3 Anthony 2/7 Fox Co. 3rd plt.

Anthony (doc) is a Navy Corpsman. He was trying to save a Marine who had encountered an IED blast when he also encountered one losing his left foot and has several fractures in his arms and legs.

LCpl. Kevin 2/7

Kevin was injured during combat operations in Afghanistan. He has suffered burns to his arms and suffered injuries to his legs. He would like to receive cards!

LCpl. David 2/7 Golf

David (nicknamed Bob) was injured in Afghanistan in June 2008. He sustained a hearing injury and is having trouble with his right shoulder, arm and hand.

LCpl. Arturo 2/7

Arturo has suffered small arms fire to his torso and hand in April 2007 in Iraq. Said he would love to hear from people from all over the country.

HM2 Anthony 2/7 Fox Co.

Anthony was injured April 2007 when a vehicle full of explosives was detonated under the overpass his marines were guarding. He and 7 others were injured in the incident. Anthony sustained a severe head injury a wound to his back a punctured right lung and minor scrapes to his legs arms and face.

CPL. Eric 2/7

Eric was injured in an attack in April 2007. He has lost his right leg and has a severely broken arm and facial bones.

LCpl. Brandon 2/7

Brandon was injured in an attack in April 2007 His left hand had to be amputated and both of his heel have been badly fractured. He will be in recovery for quite some time.

LCpl. John D. 2/7 Weapons

John received two gunshot wounds to the leg and a brain injury while on combat operations in Iraq in March 2007. He has nerve damage. John has been fitted with a leg brace and has been walking and is reported doing well.

SGT. Dylan ¾ H&S Co.

Dylan was severely injured in an IED blast Feb. 2007. He lost both legs from mid calves down. He was on his 3rd deployment. He has a wife and a young son.

DUTIES OF THE DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT

This is the second in our series explaining the duties of the various council officer positions. We hope that this will help our members have a better understanding of the duties of the various officers and Service Program Directors. We will continue to provide a description of the other positions in the coming months.

The following is a description of the Deputy Grand Knights duties as found in the Charter Constitution Laws of the Knights of Columbus.

DEPUTY GRAND KNIGHT

The Deputy Grand Knight shall preside in the absence or inability of the Grand Knight and execute all the duties of the Grand Knight. He shall perform such other duties as the Order may impose. In the absence of the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight, then the duty of presiding at a meeting of the council shall devolve on the other officers of the council in the order in which they are named in section 126 after the Deputy Grand Knight; Chancellor, Recorder, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Lecturer, Advocate, Warden, Inside Guard, Outside Guard, and Board of Trustees.

That was the technical description. The Deputy Grand Knight works closely with the Grand Knight on a variety of things. He assists the Grand Knight with the preparation of reports. The Deputy Grand Knight is in charge of the various committees of the council and is responsible or recruiting and appointing chairpersons for the committees. By the end of his term as Deputy Grand Knight he would be familiar with the duties of the Grand Knight and would be considered a viable candidate for that position.

KEEP IN TOUCH
